**Participants MUST complete both days for ICS 300 to receive credit for training*

AUDIENCE: We ask that senior members of your hospital who will have a leadership role in their facility's incident command system attend this training.

These courses will provide training on resources for healthcare personnel who require an advanced application of ICS. These are individuals who may assume a supervisory role in expanding incidents which may extend into multiple operational periods. ICS 300 will include unified command, incident/event assessment and objective development; the ICS planning process; incident/event resource management, transfer of command and demobilization. ICS 400 will include ICS review for Command and General Staff; major and/or complex incidents/events management; area command and multi-agency coordination.

Documentation of the following pre-requisites is required to attend ICS 300:

- ✓ IS 100: Introduction to the Incident Command System
- ✓ IS 200: ICS for Single Resources and Initial Action Incidents
- ✓ IS 700: Introduction to the National Incident Management System (NIMS)
- ✓ IS 800.b National Response Framework, An Introduction

Documentation of the following pre-requisites is required to attend ICS 400:

- ✓ ICS 300: Intermediate ICS for Expanding Incidents

- If you have already completed applicable the pre-requisites, please fax a copy of the completion certificates with your registration form.
